As Acting Chief Constable of North Yorkshire Police, I offer my sincere apologies to the LGBTQ+ community for any historical discriminatory behaviour they were subjected to by any member of this force.

To rebuild trust, it's important to recognise the harm caused not only to the individuals subject to unacceptable police behaviours of the past, but also the upset and distress experienced by their families and loved ones, and the LGBTQ+ community as a whole. I recognise that it's important to acknowledge former injustices, to forge stronger relationships for the future. I hope that this acknowledgment demonstrates our commitment as a force to work with our LGBTQ+ to do exactly that.

I was pleased to see the recognition you gave in your letter to UK policing's current supportive policies towards the LGBTQ+ community.

Our county's Pride events are an eagerly anticipated and valuable opportunity for us to engage positively with our LGBTQ+ communities. Our participation demonstrates our support for the LGBTQ+ community within North Yorkshire and reflects our understanding of the challenges many still face from discrimination and hate crime. I hope that our attendance also actively displays our commitment to keeping the LGBTQ+ community safe and feeling safe.

Pride also provides a positive platform for LGBTQ+ members of our own workforce to be visible and proud, both of who they are and the vital service they provide to the community every day.
